

IDENTIFY YOUR HORSE

Horse Theives apparently haven't died out with the old west, recently in Lodi two broodmares, one valued @ \$25,000, were stolen from a breeding farms pasture.

In the last two years the incidence of horse theft has increased alarmingly, with a recovery rate of only 50% at the very best.

California has very few laws to protect your horse. A thief apprehended on the freeway with stolen horses in their trailer cannot be convicted as there are not laws against transporting the stolen animals! No papers or proof of ownership are required to sell or ship horses in this state. With the price of horse meat going up, almost any horse is worth \$400-\$500 to the renderer. This makes horse theft relatively low risk & profitable.

Branding or tatooing can help to definitely identify a stolen animal. A prominent shoulder or hip brand can help to deter theft altogether. For information contact:



The Hoffackers purchased Hobby as a weanling and raised her at their stable in Woodside.


Hobby was started by local trainer Lew Silva, and shown by Kathy Cromwell, until the Hoffackers daughter Diane learned trail.

HILDA GURNEY



Miss Gurney is the top rated dressage rider in the United States. She broke and trained her outstanding T.B. champion dressage horse, Keen, herself. As a teenager Miss Gurney trained the horses of the Onadarka drill team to perform without bridles. TRY TO REMEMBER

Some day when you are breezing along Veterans Boulevard in Redwood City, fighting the traffic, try to remember that it is old Bayshore Highway. The entrance to the Rodeo grounds was in the area of where Brewster joins Veterans Boulevard.

The Peninsula Celebration Association purchased 120 acres here in 1949, the first Rodeo at this site was held in 1950. Through 1963 equestrians enjoyed sitting on their horses and watching the rodeos following their participation in the Redwood City July 4 parade. After the Grand Entry in the Rodeos, sitting erect to hear the National Anthem, the horsemen "let the colors fly".

In that era it was common for the horsemen to ride from rural areas to Redwood City to participate in this event. From Woodside they rode through the open fields to Redwood City through what is now Farm Hills. For one thing there was no 280 and depending on which way you were going, Woodside Road either began or ended at El Camino.
