

HORSES OF THE PAST

ENGLAND'S GREAT CHALK WHITE HORSES

By Mrs. Steven Fischer

For centuries there has been a great deal of discussion over the great chalk white horses which appear in some sections of England. One of these appears on a Hillside near Westbury. Some believe this one was carved in 879 to commemorate Alfreds' victory over the Danes at Ethandune. This version, however, is open to doubt.

In the South Country there are other chalk carvings on hillsides, all are centuries old.

These downs, so peaceful and empty today, were the center of a thriving population in prehistoric times. Many remains of their fortifications and encampments may still be seen. There are six more White Horses in Wiltshire around the Westbury area.

The White Horse at Uffington is another figure which people have wondered about for centuries. This is so stylized as to appear modern in origin, yet it is cited as a Berkshire landmark in the annals of Abington Abbey as early as the eleventh century. This section is called the Vale of the White Horse.

At the Pescadero Rodeo Nuggie Olsen placed second in Stock Horse and Betty Purvis took fifth in the same class.






